HUSBAND- James McGavock

A short bio from the book "Max Meadows, Virginia: Destined for Glory":

"James McGavock was born in 1728 in Antrim, Ireland, and came to America in 1752. He was a private stationed at the old Fort Chiswell, where he also served as quartermaster of the fort. He had several enterprises in the Fort Chiswell area, which spread further north into Max Meadows. He built a log home(1.) there around 1789 which is still standing. He and his wife later moved into the home where he lived until his death. McGavock saw potential growth in the lovely valley and purchased several hundred acres of the Anchor and Hope Estate, previously owned by the Buchanan and Sayers families. Randal McGavock, one of his heirs, sold much of the land to the Pennsylvania developers to build the town. James McGavock died in 1812."

Note:

1. McGavock built a two-story log home for his son David and his daughter-in-law at the time of their marriage in 1779 or 1780. The cabin measured thirty by sixteen feet and had two large rooms downstairs,

CHILD 3 - James McGavock Jr

From; The McGavock Family by Rev. Robert Gray, 1903

James lived and died at the old homestead, Fort Chiswell. The house, composed partly of logs, was burned down in 1901, and being on the main road from Lynchburg, VA, to Knoxville, Tenn., a road much used for transporting goods from the eastern markets to the west, and also a stage route, was long known as one of the best country taverns in Virginia. In that day, the traveling public demanding it, houses of entertainment were kept by not a few of the wealthiest and best families. Here General Andrew Jackson, traveling to and from Washington city by private conveyance, often stayed, being a personal friend of this McGavock and of others, especially David, Randal and Jacob, of Tennessee.

The Fort Chiswell land was originally granted, by the Crown, to Thomas Walker; and the fort, built for defense against the Indians, was named for Captain Chiswell, an English officer.

CHILD 4 - Mayor Randal McGavock

Randal accompanied his brother David to Tennessee, aiding him first in his surveys, and afterward as his deputy in the Land Office. For several years he was Clerk of Circuit Court of Davidson county, TN, also Clerk of the Supreme Court of Errors and Appeals, and in 1824-25 was Mayor of the city of Nashville. He removed to Williamson county, TN, in 1825, where he resided until his death 27 Sept 1844.

About 1825 Randal built "Carnton Mansion", named for the McGavock ancestral home in County Antrim, Ireland. It was said to be the most elegant estate in Williamson County. The mansion and 10 acres were donated to the Carnton Association, Inc, a volunteer non-profit organization in 1978. They have tried to restore it to its original grandeur and it is open to the public for tours. Some of the original pieces of furniture previously taken by family members have now been returned.

In an article "The McGavocks of Midway", by Ridley Wills, II, (date unknown), published in the Williamson County Historical Society Journal, the following is written about Randal:

"Born in 1768, Randal grew up during the turbulent Revolutionary War years. In 1787, he was appointed ensign in Captain Evan's company of Virginia militia. Some years later, possibly in September 1791, he entered Dickinson College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. There, he was a member of the Belles Lettres Society, a debating group which dominated Dickinson undergraduate life."

CHILD 5 - Margaret McGavock

Margaret was the mother of 14 children, seven sons & seven daughters and all lived to maturity. Her husband, Col. Joseph Kent, was a brother to the wife of Hugh McGavock, her older brother.

CHILD 6 - Mary McGavock

Married Philip Gaines in 1798. No children.

CHILD 7 - Cynthia McGavock

Cynthia's dates of birth and death are unknown. She never married.

CHILD 8 - Elizabeth McGavock

Priestly; but soon after entered the office of his uncle Randal, the then clerk of the Circuit Court. In 1813 he volunteered in the Creek war, and was one of General Andrew Jackson's aids, but being disabled by a wound in the battle of Enotochopco, 24 Jan 1814, he was honorably discharged.

He was severally County, Circuit and United States Circuit Clerk, for half a century, occupying the last position at the breaking out of the Civil war in 1861. His wife, born at Bardstown, KY, 10 Feb 1798, and died at Nashville, 19 Jan 1878, was the eldest daughter of Hon. CHILD 5 - Col. Randal William McGavock

Col. Randal W. McGavock was killed in battle at Raymond, MS. He was buried in the graveyard in Raymond. A few weeks later, his sister Ann and her husband, Judge Henry Dickenson, traveled to Raymond and made arrangements for the body to be brought to their home in Columbus Miss. After the war, the remains were moved one final time to Mt. Olivet Cemetery in Nashville, TN. On St. Patrick's Day, 1866, McGavock was buried. The ceremony was conducted by the Masons amid a large crowd that included most of the city's Irish and most of the veterans of the 10th Tenn.

CHILD 6 - Edward Jacob McGavock

He operated a large plantation at Pecan Point, Ark., from 1852 to the time of his death, in New Orleans. Of his second wife it has been written: "Her deeds of benevolence were many, her gifts of charity unostentatious. The governing law of her life was 'when thou doest thine alms, let not thy left hand know
